

AVENUE OF FLAGS

Indiantown Gap National Cemetery began serving the veteran community in 1982. The Indiantown Gap National Cemetery Memorial Council, is an IRS recognized 501(c)(3) nonprofit PA Corporation. It is not part of the Veterans Administration or any of its components, has no governmental status, and receives no government funding. It has supported the Cemetery throughout the years. Volunteers from veterans service organizations, individuals, clubs, schools, churches, youth groups and businesses make up the Memorial Council membership. The Council sponsors Memorial Day and Veterans Day activities as well as The Avenue of Flags.

The Avenue of Flags is a presentation of flags beginning at the main entrance and winding its way through the Cemetery. These flags are interment flags, donated to the Cemetery in honor of a deceased veteran for the purpose of flying in the Avenue of Flags.

These flags may be the interment flag from any veteran or active duty person, no matter where they are buried. They are presented in loving memory of those who gave their all and are displayed with the same loving care.

Flag donations can be placed in a collection box in front of the Administration building entrance any day from sunrise to dusk. Please complete a donation form.

When a flag is donated, cemetery personnel do not know when your flag will be flown or from which flagpole. Donated flags are used as needed to replace worn flags. Nameplates are not placed on flagpoles.
